Drop-Off Procedures

Please follow these instructions for **free** disposal of your unwanted medications:

1. Gather all unwanted medications

from where you have them stored.

2. If possible, leave all medications in their original containers. You may black out any personal information that is on the hottle.

3. Bring the medications to the secured drug collection box. Located in the Hobart Police Department lobby.

Did you know?

Monitoring the Future Study showed that 2.7% of 8th graders, 7.7% of 10th graders, and 8.0% of 12th graders had abused Vicodin and 2.1% of 8th graders, 4.6% of 10th graders, and 5.1% of 12th graders had abused OxyContin for nonmedical purposes.

Safe Storage & Safety Tips

Always store medications in the original containers.

Never keep medications past their expiration date.

Always store separately medications for family members.

Never guess on how much medication to take

Read the label before you open the bottle to ensure the right dosage is taken.

Never let young children take medicine by themselves.

Don't store medications in areas that are hot and humid, such as the bathroom medicine cabinet.

Lock your medicine cabinet. A cabinet or a drawer with a lock on it would also work.

Do talk with your children about the dangers of drug abuse!

available 24 hours per day,
7 days a week.

Where do the drugs go?

Our partners at the DEA (Drug Enforcement Administration) periodically schedule Drug Take-Back Days. The DEA then safely destroys the drugs.
