RESOLUTION NO. 2020-08

**A Resolution Approving the Extension of the Mayor's Executive Order, 2020-01,
Declaration of a Local Disaster Emergency in the City of Hobart**

WHEREAS, both the President of the United States and the Governor of Indiana have declared a public health emergency for Coronavirus Disease 2019 Outbreak ("COVID-19"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Hobart issued Executive Order 2020-01 on March 24, 2020 declaring a Local Disaster Emergency in the City of Hobart for a period of seven (7) days due to the threat of COVID-19 stating the efforts necessary to contain and control the spread of COVID 19, a true and accurate copy of Executive Order 2020-01 is attached herewith as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Law, the Mayor's Executive Order declaring a Local Disaster Emergency can be extended for a period exceeding seven (7) days with the consent of the Common Council of the City of Hobart; and

WHEREAS, it is evident that the said COVID 19 emergency will exist for an extended period of time; and

WHEREAS, the Council supports the issuance of and wishes to grant the Mayor of the City of Hobart the authority to extend Executive Order 2020-01 declaring a Local Disaster Emergency and the efforts necessary to address the threat of COVID 19 until such time he determines that the spread of COVID 19 no longer poses a threat to the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Hobart grants the Mayor authority, for such a time period he deems necessary, to extend Executive Order 2020-01, issued on March 24, 2020, declaring a Local Disaster Emergency relating to COVID 19.

ALL OF WHICH IS ADOPTED on this 27th day of MARCH, 2020 by the Common Council of the City of Hobart, Indiana.

**CITY OF HOBART, INDIANA
EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2020-01
March 24, 2020**

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2020, Eric J. Holcomb, Governor of Indiana, declared a public health emergency for Coronavirus Disease 2019 Outbreak (“COVID-19”) pursuant to I.C. 10-14-3-12; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national emergency for the same; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020, The Governor of the State of Indiana ordered that all residents without an “Essential Need” to be outside, stay in their homes;


WHEREAS, a local disaster emergency exists in the City of Hobart due to serious threat to the health, safety, and welfare of its residents posed by COVID-19;

WHEREAS, to help combat the known health threat it is necessary to issue Orders that further the efforts to contain and control the spread of COVID 19, including Orders that result in the reduction of person to person contact.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, I, Mayor Brian K. Snedecor, pursuant to Indiana law, do hereby issue the following Executive Order:

1. The declaration of a local disaster emergency in the City of Hobart is hereby declared and immediately in effect for a period of seven (7) days, unless said declaration is terminated sooner by Executive Order of the Mayor, or extended if the current conditions continue to exist;
2. All City of Hobart employees who perform Essential Governmental Functions, as defined by Governor Holcomb in Executive Order No. 20-08, dated March 23, 2020, are expected to continue their work as usual; those City of Hobart employees who perform non-essential functions shall work from home to the extent their work can be completed at home;
3. All City of Hobart buildings will be closed to public access;
4. All regularly scheduled public meetings are cancelled until further notice;
5. The City of Hobart will continue to provide trash pick-up and public safety functions; and
6. Late fees for payments through the Sanitary District due after March 24, 2020 will not be imposed until further action by the Sanitary Board.
