COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOBART, INDIANA 1 2 **Ordinance No. 2020 - 37** 3 An Ordinance Amending the Municipal Code of the City of Hobart Concerning 4 5 Nuisances 6 WHEREAS, the Common Council ("Council") of the City of Hobart, Indiana ("City") 7 has been informed that the various nuisances are occurring within the City which require 8 9 enforcement by City Code Enforcement Officers; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Council has determined that it is necessary to further illustrate the instances of nuisances within the City of Hobart Municipal Code to effectively enforce 12 violations; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, the Council, through this Ordinance, desires to include additional illustrative enumerations of nuisances to adequately address violations within the City: 16 17 18 THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Hobart as follows: 19 20 21 SECTION ONE: The Municipal Code of the City of Hobart ("Code") is hereby amended by adding the following new language to Title IX entitled 22 "GENERAL REGULATIONS," Chapter 96: NUISANCES under § 96.02 23 24 ILLUSTRATIVE ENUMERATION by adding additional language to sub-sections 25 (D) (J) and (N) and new paragraphs to be designated as (N)(1), (2), (3) and (4) as follows: 26 27 §96.02 ILLUSTRATIVE ENUMERATION. 28 29 The maintaining, using, placing depositing, leaving or permitting to be or remain on any 30 public or private property of the following items, conditions or actions are hereby declared to be 31 and constitute a nuisance; provided, however, this enumeration shall not be deemed or construed 32 to be conclusive, limiting or restrictive: 33 34 Noxious weeds and other rank vegetation; 35 (A) 36 Accumulation of rubbish, trash, refuse, junk and other abandoned materials, metals, 37 (B) lumber or other things; 38 39 (C) Any condition which provides harborage for rats, mice, snakes and other vermin; 40 41 42 Any building or other structure which is in such dilapidated condition that it is unfit for human habitation, kept in such an unsanitary condition that it is a menace to the health of 43 people residing in the vicinity thereof, or presents a more than ordinary dangerous fire hazard in 44

the vicinity where it is located, including, but not limited to, structural instability or danger of

collapse from termites, rodents or other vermin;
