Why Downtown?

Businesses located in the downtown business district benefit from the foot traffic and synergy created by neighboring businesses, as well as Lakefront Park. Purposefully designed to increase exposure to our local businesses, the Oak Savannah Bike Trail runs two blocks south of downtown. Hobart's beautiful Lake George and its accompanying parks make Hobart's downtown unique. The brick trail along Lake George connecting Lake Front Park and Festival Park draws in locals year round. Hobart is all about community, and our downtown businesses have come together to form a cooperative marketing group exclusive to the downtown. Downtown Hobart Business Coalition

The Downtown Hobart Business Coalition (DHBC) is a new organization of downtown businesses, city officials, and realtors dedicated to strengthening the downtown. Current goals include cooperative marketing among the downtown businesses.

Hobart History

Due to Hobart's prime natural resource, the waterways of Deep River and Lake George, Hobart was one of the first settled areas in the region. Hobart's history dates beyond the days of the settlers. This area was communally used and revered by the native Potawatomi people.

The town was platted in 1849 by George Earle who named the town after his brother Frederick Hobart Earle.

The first industry to develop in Hobart was a gristmill. Within ten years, railways were being developed. An opera house was opened along with meat markets, shoe stores, and lumber yards.

Because brickmaking was a prominent industry in the nineteenth century, the School City of Hobart adopted the Brickie as its mascot.

Downtown Hobart is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Lake George Commercial Historic District

Because Downtown Hobart is also a local historic district, it is important to check with the Planning and Zoning Department at (219) 942-7985 to see if your business is located within the boundary of the Lake George Commercial Historic District.

Advantages of Locating in the Historic District

The Lake George Commercial Historic District preserves the history and charm of the façades of downtown buildings, creating a more cohesive and interesting look for the downtown. This added character attracts tourists to the downtown, helping your business and the local economy.

Business Opportunities

Locating your business in the Historic District offers many advantages including district based grants. The Façade & Signage Grant program provides financial assistance for the renovation of your building's front exterior, your business's sign, and/or your business's awning. Historic District Guidelines

Design guidelines for the historic district ensure that the historic character of the buildings in downtown are being properly preserved. Exterior renovations to buildings in the historic district require a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) from the Historic Preservation Commission. It is important to contact City Planner Ross Pietrzak at (219) 942-7985 or rpietrzak@cityofhobart.org to discuss these regulations and the approval process before starting renovation. Hobart School District

Hobart is served by three different school districts, the largest of which is the School City of Hobart. The School City of Hobart schools are highly rated by the State of Indiana. Hobart High School offers a variety of AP/Early College courses in addition to skill-based training through the Porter County Career Center. A student can graduate from Hobart High School with a variety of certifications such as CISCO and EMT. Hobart schools provide excellent opportunities with a personal connection to its students to ensure their success.

Community Connections

Hobart Events aims to bring the community together with activities for the whole family all year round. Residents can always expect large turnouts for the Annual Hobart Lakefront Festival, weekly Summer Markets, and the annual Dam Duck Race. 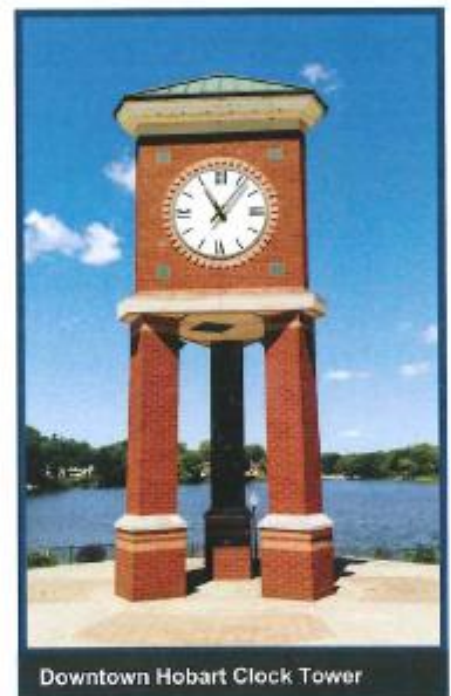
Hobart is a growing community with plenty to offer. Hobart's proximity to larger regional cities means that our market extends beyond the city limits. Residents are close enough for day trips to Chicago or afternoons on Lake Michigan, yet the suburban setting offers large yards and quiet streets.

Hobart's dedication to green space and active living allow residents to explore our numerous parks and preserves. Hobart has more than 215 acres of recreational parks and over 800 acres of wildlife preserves. In fact, Hobart has several parks and playgrounds located right on Lake George and Robinson Lake.

Riverfront District and Riverfront Liquor Licenses

Hobart's Riverfront District was established to encourage unique restaurants to open downtown. The district runs along Main Street and extends all the way to New Street. A map is included in the Downtown Business Handbook.

Staying on Schedule: Calendars and Deadlines

During the process of opening a new business, approval may be needed from a City board or commission. The City staff will assist you in obtaining any necessary approvals that may be required from the City's boards or commissions. Please refer to the schedule below for meeting dates and filing deadlines. Should you have any questions about the meeting schedules, please feel free to contact a member of the City staff.

- The **Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA)** approves Developmental Standard Variances, Conditional Uses, and Use Variances. They meet the first Thursday of every month at 6:00 p.m. Applications are due by noon the Tuesday after the previous meeting.
- The **Plan Commission** approves site plans and makes recommendations to the Common Council regarding rezoning applications. They meet the first Thursday of every month at 7:00 p.m. Applications are due by noon the Tuesday after the previous meeting.
- The **Common Council** approves rezoning recommendations. They meet on the first and third Wednesday of every month at 6:00 p.m.
- The **Hobart Historic Preservation Commission (HHPC)** approves the Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) applications. They meet on the third Tuesday of every month at 5:30 p.m. Applications must be provided a minimum of 15 days before the meeting at which they will be discussed.
- The **Redevelopment Commission (RDC)** approves the Façade and Signage Grant applications. They meet on an as needed basis.
